Loyola Press Sunday Family Connections

Gospel Reading
Matthew 14:13-21



Jesus feeds the crowd with five loaves and two fish.

In our family life we can sometimes hear echoes of the disciples' excuses: "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." Sometimes this echo is heard from children squabbling about the last piece of cake. Sometimes it is heard in our concern about the limits of the family's income or possessions. Sometimes this echo is heard in our complaints about the seemingly endless demands for our time and attention. Jesus understood these feelings and taught us to see beyond our limitations. Jesus modeled for us a compassion that reaches out to others, even when we would rather withdraw into ourselves. Jesus taught us that God blesses compassion offered to others with his grace. Today's Gospel reminds us that with God there is not only enough, there is an abundance!

Talk together about some of the stresses and demands for time and attention that your family members might feel. Acknowledge that we sometimes have to make difficult choices about how to use our time, talents, and treasure. Then read together today's Gospel, Matthew 14:13-21. Notice how much Jesus cared for the crowds, healing the sick even though he wanted to withdraw to a quiet place. Notice how the disciples responded to Jesus' instruction to feed the crowd; they noted their limited supply of food. Jesus blessed this limited supply of food, and it was enough to feed the entire crowd, more than 5,000 people, and there were leftovers! Pray together that Jesus will grant us compassion like his so that we will offer whatever we have to others with compassion and generosity. Pray together today's Psalm, Psalm 145, or the Lord's Prayer.

Sacristan arrives early to prepare the altar for Mass. This ministry involves setting the books for the Mass, preparing the Chalice, and making sure all items needed for Mass are in place. After mass, the same items are put away properly.

Extraordinary Minister (EM) this ministry is commissioned to assist the priest in distributing communion

Lector this includes reading the payer before Mass, first and second reading and prayers of the faithful.

Usher this ministry involves coming in early to greet people as they enter the church, taking care of the collection and helping people find seating as needed during large masses.

Alter Server assists the priests in procession and during Mass, Must be 7 yrs old or older and have made your first communion. Yes, Adults you are welcome too.

Homebound Minister This ministry takes communion to the sick and homebound. Generally, it could be just 1 or 2 persons that you would take communion to. There is a guided script to help and training . Having people who live in different part of the parish is helpful.

Religious Education This ministry teaches or supports teachers in religious education of parish children to grow in faith, understanding, and love preparing them to receive the sacraments and to build a future with Christ at the center of their heart.
Youth Ministy There currently isn’t an active ministry, but if you have this call maybe something in th future is possible.

Todays Reflection
Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)
Sunday August 2, 2026

The Innermost Desire

Today’s First Reading (Isaiah 55:1-3) is one of the great roots of spirituality for the Biblical tree. It talks about desire. If you are thirsty, come to the water. If you are hungry, come and eat. It is as simple as that.

Some people laugh if I ask them whether they know the hymn "Come to the Water." To them it is like asking whether they have heard the Star Spangled Banner. Since I am the composer of "Come to the Water" (but not of the Star Spangled Banner!), I am humbled.

But of course it is not "my" hymn, it is ours. The Christian and Catholic community understand Isaiah’s words (the words of the hymn) as naming something very deep within them, a mighty and profound opening within human beings in which they can taste the sweetness of the Lord. I think of huge areas of the world physically without enough food or water, such a scourge upon the earth. You and I can help solve it. But only by feeling the keen hunger within us for God.

Only God can slake our thirst for being loved and giving love, our need for the whole of our life to make sense, our feeling of emptiness at odd times or maybe all the time, our desire for "something more" than our difficult lives can provide. Some of us are simply hoping that there is some reason for hoping at all.

Only God can give out food good enough to satisfy our longing, because only God is the creator and lover of all that is. He is not some being who created the world some time in the distant past and then sat back to let things take their course, however rough that course may be. God creates all things right now, continuing to keep everything in existence right this second. Even one centimeter of a second’s inattention on the part of God and the world would cease.

To the eyes of faith this continuous creation is a beautiful cause for quiet gratitude.

"Come to the Water" says as much: "Why should you spend your life, except for the Lord." The word "spend" here calls to mind spending your wages. But more important, the Gospel for Sunday says how Jesus paid out his own life. It is a special scene. Jesus is grieving for his mentor and friend, John the Baptist. He want to be alone in order to let that grief happen. But instead of solitude, Jesus finds a huge crowd of hungry people, hoping he will feed their souls. His heart is moved by them. He puts aside his own sadness and cures them. He feeds their hunger and slakes their thirst.

In the Gospel reading it is their physical needs he attends to, as a symbol of their deeper hunger. And on Sunday you and I will be fed by his life itself (especially when we hear the readings) and by his very passion, death and resurrection (Eucharistic rite, Communion). We are invited in. Our deepest longing is to be assuaged. We are fed.

"Take this, all of you, and eat it. This is my body."
