Loyola Press Sunday Family Connections

Gospel Reading
Matthew 13

Jesus teaches that the kingdom of heaven is like seed that has been sown on good soil.

Today’s Gospel reminds us that in order for God’s Word to take root in us and produce abundant fruit, we must endeavor to be like good soil. Families, in particular, hold the responsibility for “preparing the soil” so that the seeds of God’s Word can grow strong. There are many ways in which families do this—family traditions in which faith is celebrated, prayer and reading of Scripture, and instruction on the faith. In these ways, parents fulfill the promises they made at their child’s Baptism.

Gather together as a family and reflect together on the Sacrament of Baptism. Tell the story of the Baptism of each child, showing any pictures that were taken. If you have your child’s Baptism candle or gown, share these as well. Recall together that one of the promises that parents make at their child’s Baptism is to bring them up in the practice of our faith. Talk together about the importance of this promise to your family. Then read together today’s Gospel, Matthew 13:1-23. Reflect together on the ways in which your family practices your faith (daily prayer, Mass attendance, religious instruction, etc.). Remind one another that we do these things as a family so that God’s Word can take root in our lives and produce abundant fruit. Conclude in prayer together by praying today’s Psalm, Psalm 65.

Have you been wondering if you are being called to active ministry in our church?

There is training for every ministry ad you will have opportunities to practice. It's normal to be nervous, its something new, important and beautiful. Take a chance.

Sacristan arrives early to prepare the altar for Mass. This ministry involves setting the books for the Mass, preparing the Chalice, and making sure all items needed for Mass are in place. After mass, the same items are put away properly.

Extraordinary Minister (EM) this ministry is commissioned to assist the priest in distributing communion

Lector this includes reading the payer before Mass, first and second reading and prayers of the faithful.

Usher this ministry involves coming in early to greet people as they enter the church, taking care of the collection and helping people find seating as needed during large masses.

Alter Server assists the priests in procession and during Mass, Must be 7 yrs old or older and have made your first communion. Yes, Adults you are welcome too.

Homebound Minister This ministry takes communion to the sick and homebound. Generally, it could be just 1 or 2 persons that you would take communion to. There is a guided script to help and training . Having people who live in different part of the parish is helpful.

Religious Education This ministry teaches or supports teachers in religious education of parish children to grow in faith, understanding, and love preparing them to receive the sacraments and to build a future with Christ at the center of their heart.

Youth Ministy There currently isn't an active ministry, but if you have this call maybe something in th future is possible.

Layers of Wisdom

Look at the many different depths and types of wisdom in the world, and thus in this Sunday’s Mass.

Here is an everyday example. I remember a cartoon in the New Yorker magazine years ago that etched itself in my mind. A terribly decrepit old man is sitting on his front porch while a very beautiful woman walks by on the sidewalk. His mouth is hanging open. George Booth was the cartoonist, so of course there is one of his terrible flea-bitten dogs at the man’s feet.

His equally haggard wife is at the door, with the screen pushed open just far enough to take in this scene. She says to him, “Well whistle, you damn fool!”

I suppose I had expected her to load guilt on the leering old man in his act of leering. Instead, Booth gave us what are really just words of everyday common sense. “Don’t just sit there: at least do what every other heterosexual male in the world would do.” So. Wisdom comes in many flavors, and there is a kind of common, real acumen in the old lady’s words.

Now, let us examine Sunday’s readings for different types of wisdom.

In the Gospel, Jesus uses the common sense kind. He says, if you went out into a field and saw a suspicious mound of earth, and you happened to dig it up, and you found there a hidden treasure—as much gold as you could ever want—would you immediately go and tell everyone about it?

Of course not. It is like “Well whistle, you damn fool!” Common sense says you would re-bury the treasure, disguising it perfectly, and then go sell all your property and come buy the field. Now the treasure is yours. “Look at what I found on my new property!”

It is an excellent example. It makes sense. Well then, Jesus asks, wouldn’t you do as much for the kingdom of heaven? He has suddenly deepened the wisdom!

And in the First Reading, Solomon uses another flavor of wisdom. He asks not for selfish gifts, but for an understanding heart so that he can rule God’s people. This request moves God. He gives Solomon great practical wisdom in order that he might succeed as King. And other gifts as well.

Perhaps the deepest wisdom this Sunday is in the Second Reading. You and I have undoubtedly quoted these words, not remembering where they came from, “All things work for the good [of] those who love God.” The older I get, the more true this seems. Even when darkness and loss become our daily bread, still the love of God labors incessantly to bring out greater forgiveness, larger love, more acceptance of life and love, even within pain. This is the wisest understanding that can be.

Sunday at Mass we can pay attention to any of these varieties of wisdom. The important thing is not to just sit there and gape, but to do what every other human being in the world would do if given a glimpse into the kingdom.

Listen to God’s love, you sleepyhead!
